## Neighbourhood and Alley Renewal is coming to Gariepy and planning is underway!

Starting in Spring 2024, Gariepy will experience Neighbourhood and Alley Renewal construction. Through the City's Building Great Neighbourhoods Branch, the Neighbourhood and Alley Renewal Program will reconstruct roads, curbs, alleys, replace street lights, repair sidewalks, and where possible, connect missing sidewalk links. Other neighbourhood improvements such as street crossings, additional bike connections, and improvements to City-owned parks and gathering spaces will also be explored.

The event coincided with the first flooding of the rinks, which we were happy to return in-full this season with fewer use restrictions!

## Hall Renovations and Upgrades!

ast year was tough on a lot of us. Our community hall was no exception. In an unseasonally strong wind storm last winter, a our hall's roof lost a great number of shingles that ended up all over the park grounds. This unfortunate event set us to look at ways to improve our communioty amenity space. Under the lead of our Facilities Director Jason, we've been able to accomplish a lot the last few months. This includes a new roof (provided by a great local company, DMasters), a new furnance, new fascia and rain gutters, a re-decking of the tractor ramp, hazard/dead tree removal, servicing our ice rink tractor, and deck railing repairs. This work was completed thanks to grants we've been fortunate to recieve as well as the commitment of volunteers (who provided their time at our July 2021 casino fundraiser, and their labour when called upon).

We were also fortunate recently to upgrade and expand our collection of equipment! Things we've acquired/updat ed recently include additional adusnowshoes to loan to community members, new propane firepits, and more effecient ice making equipment!

We don't intend to stop there! Plans are in the works for other repairs and upgrades to ensure our hall and the surrounding grounds serve us well into the future.



# **KEEPING OUR COMMUNITIES SAFE**

Over the last several months one of the crimes that we have been noting in our community is theft from vehicles and garages. To help prevent theft, please remove valuables from your vehicle and always double check that your vehicle is locked. Phones, laptops, cash/coins, purses and garage door openers are common items stolen from vehicles. If these items are out of sight your vehicle will be less likely to be targeted. You can report suspicious activity to the non-emergency police line by calling 780-423-4567. If you see a crime in progress please dial 911 and do not engage.

With the cold winter temperatures it may be tempting to start your car and leave it to warm up while waiting inside your home, but please remember that it is never safe to leave your vehicle idling and unattended, even for a brief period of time.

The Edmonton Police Service has recently posted about idling auto theft, stating that this crime of opportunity usually takes place on weekdays during peak commuting times (5:00 am- 8:30 am) when individuals are preparing to travel.
